About Portland

The “City of Roses” is also a city of parks, rivers, bridges, micro-breweries, innovative dining, and a young music and art scene. The city and surrounding areas offer activities to please everyone from the outdoor enthusiast to the oenophile. Forest Park is an urban wonderland with miles of beautiful hiking trails and it is only a short drive to the beautiful Oregon Coast and the magnificent Columbia Gorge. Shopping and sight-seeing opportunities abound in Downtown, the Pearl District, Old Town, Lloyd Center and Portland’s many other neighborhoods. Travel Information

Air travelers to Portland arrive at Portland International Airport (www.flypdx.com). PDX is about a 20-minute taxi ride from downtown Portland, or about 40 minutes by MAX light rail, which will take you within two blocks of the workshop location.

Portland is also served by Amtrak, and arriving passengers are only a short taxi ride from downtown.

Workshop Location

The Hotel Monaco Portland is a luxury boutique facility conveniently located in the heart of Portland, only steps from Nordstrom, Pioneer Place Mall and many fine restaurants. The galleries, restaurants and shops of

Nob Hill and the Pearl District are reached easily by the nearby Portland Streetcar, and MAX provides quick access to the Washington Park Zoo, Children’s Museum, Hoyt Arboretum, the Japanese and Rose Gardens, the Oregon Convention Center and Lloyd District shopping and dining.

Climate/Dress

Portland enjoys a moderate climate year-round and in mid-September, temperatures average between 52 and 75 degrees with the occasional rain shower. As a rule Portlanders dress casually, and there are only a few venues that require a coat and tie or enforce a “no denim” policy. Workshop attire is casual.

Lodging

A block of rooms has been set aside at the Hotel Monaco for NCPO Workshop attendees at the special rate of \$116 per night (including nights before and after the workshop for those who want more time to enjoy Portland).
