The primary work of a judge involves hearing and deciding matters without fear or favor and while being faithful to the law. A judge must be professionally competent, patient, courteous, dignified, and must have an ability to maintain control of the courtroom. I think that one of the greatest challenges to the role of a judge is to provide access to justice and an opportunity for every party to be heard in the face of ever decreasing resources.

There have been multiple occasions on which, long after I have sentenced somebody, I have received correspondence from that defendant in which they detail the success they have had in their lives since sentencing and attribute some of that success to what I said during their sentencing proceeding. On occasion, the words of a judge can hold particular importance to person, even when those words do not contain a ruling or order.

The increase in societal harm caused by drug abuse is of particular concern to me and I intend to work towards improving the way our justice system responds to this crisis.
