	<b>Board of Governors</b>		
SB 381	Relating to the Oregon State Bar; declaring an emergency.	Directs Board of Governors of Oregon State Bar to establish position on board for active member of bar who maintains principal office outside State of Oregon.	Chapter 122, (2015 Laws): Effective date May 20, 2015.
HB 2327	Relating to custodianship of practice of nonperforming attorney; and declaring an emergency.	Modifies statutes relating to custodianship of practice of nonperforming attorney.	Chapter 6, (2015 Laws): Effective date March 12, 2015.
HB 2328	Relating to the representation of parties in legal proceedings; and declaring an emergency.	Clarifies that party that is not natural person must appear in court proceedings by attorney unless otherwise specifically provided by law.	Chapter 7, (2015 Laws): Effective date March 12, 2015.

SB 372	Relating to final orders; declaring an emergency.	Requires agency to provide machine-readable copies of final orders to Oregon State Bar, or designee, upon request regardless of laws protecting information from disclosure.	<i>Withdrawn by Administrative Law Section.</i>
	<b>Appellate Practice</b>		
HB 2336	Relating to notices of appeal; and declaring an emergency.	Allows filing and service of notice of appeal by mailing or dispatch for delivery within three calendar days via United States Postal Service or commercial delivery service.	Chapter 80, (2015 Laws): Effective date May 18, 2015.
	<b>Business Law</b>		
HB 2330	Relating to business entity operations.	Allows business entities that convert to or merge with other business entities to specify location of plan or conversion or plan of merger and to provide copy of plan of conversion or plan of merger upon request and at no cost to owners, in lieu of including plan of conversion or plan of merger with articles of conversion or articles of merger that are filed with Secretary of State.	Chapter 28, (2015 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2016.

SB 367	Relating to execution sale of real property in planned community or condominium community solely liable for assessments imposed against real property during redemption period.	Makes purchaser at execution sale of real property in planned community or condominium community solely liable for assessments imposed against real property during redemption period.	Chapter 120, (2015 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2016.

SB 368	Relating to money awards in judicial foreclosures; and declaring an emergency.	Requires sheriff to deliver proceeds to execution sale to court administrator.	Chapter 291, (2015 Laws): Effective date June 8, 2015.
	<b>Estate Planning</b>		
SB 369	Relating to access to digital assets.	Delineates rights of certain fiduciaries to access digital assets, catalog and content of electronic communications of decedent, protected person, principal under power of attorney and settlor of trust.	<i>DIED. In committee upon adjournment.</i>
HB 2331	Relating to the Oregon Uniform Trust Code.	Provides when interests of beneficiaries vest.	Chapter 126, (2015 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2016.
	<b>Family Law</b>		
SB 370	Relating to payment of public retirement benefits to alternate payees; and declaring an emergency.	Provides that certain death benefits available to members of Public Employees Retirement System and other public employer retirement plans may be paid to former spouse and dependent child as provided in judgment of annulment of dissolution of marriage or of separation.	Chapter 506, (2015 Laws): Effective date June 19, 2015.
HB 2332	Relating to exchange of information in spousal support proceedings.	Permits parties to judgment that contains spousal support award to request required exchange of certain documents without filing request for modification of judgment with court.	<i>DIED. Tabled in Senate upon adjournment.</i>

HB 2333	Relating to tolling of statutes of limitation; and declaring an emergency.	Clarifies that certain statutes of limitation are tolled if person entitled to bring action is child or has certain disabling mental condition.	Chapter 510, (2015 Laws): Effective date June 22, 2015.
	<b>Taxation</b>		
HB 2334	Relating to affidavits alleging undue hardship filed in Oregon Tax Court; and prescribing an effective date.	Requires affidavit alleging undue hardship to be filed within 30 days after entry of order specially designating complaint for hearing in regular division of Oregon Tax Court.	Chapter 45, (2015 Laws): Effective date October 5, 2015.
	<b>Uniform Criminal Jury Instructions</b>		
HB 2335	Relating to the definition of "enter or remain unlawfully".	Revises definition of "enter or remain unlawfully" for purposes of crimes of burglary and criminal trespass.	Chapter 10, (2015 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2016.
	<b>Workers' Compensation</b>		
SB 371	Relating to notice of closure of workers' compensation claims; and declaring an emergency.	Allows insurer or self-insured employer to mail notice of closure of workers' compensation claim to beneficiaries of deceased worker under certain circumstances.	Chapter 144, (2015 Laws): Effective date May 21, 2015.
