SB 491 - DISCIPLINE SYSTEM REVIEW COMMITTEE PROPOSED CHANGES

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1. PROBLEM PRESENTED:

A. and B. In January 2015, the American Bar Association's Standing Committee on Professional Discipline submitted a report on Oregon's discipline process which was adopted by the Board of Governors and which requires statutory changes. Recommendations in the report included:

- Clarify the function and responsibilities of the Local Professional Responsibility Committees and the State Professional Responsibility Board.
- Vest the appointment of the State Professional Responsibility Board in the Supreme Court.
- Provide statutory immunity for probation and diversion monitors.
- Provide for the creation of a professional adjudicator. (Note: It is unclear if the adjudicator would be appointed by the Supreme Court or by the Oregon State bar, but we are working to clarify this issue.)
- C. The New Lawyer Mentoring Program was launched in 2011 by the Oregon State Bar and the Oregon Supreme Court. As the program has developed, a need for statutory immunity for mentors has been identified to support an open dialogue between mentors and new lawyers.

2. SOLUTION:

- A. Modify the Local Professional Responsibility Committee statute and create statutory immunity for volunteer probation and diversion monitors in ORS 9.532 and ORS 9.537.
- B. Create statutory authority for a professional adjudicator in ORS 9.534.
- C. Create a statutory immunity for mentors in ORS 9.537.
