A "highly qualified" recommendation is intended to be objective, and the Committee's decision not to identify any specific candidate as "highly qualified" should not be viewed as a finding that the person is unqualified. A "highly qualified" recommendation is intended to reflect the candidate's overall ability to serve on the court.
