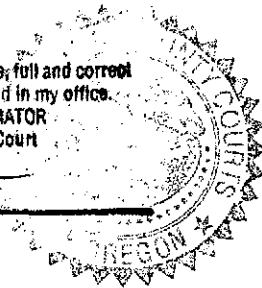

PERMANENT INJUNCTION

(Unlawful Practice of Law)

The above-entitled matter came before the undersigned Judge on the stipulations of the parties. Plaintiff, Oregon State Bar, appeared through Helen Hierschbiel Deputy General Counsel, and Richard D. Rodeman, Special Counsel. Defendants Heather Peterson, Ryan Peterson appeared in person and on behalf of We the People, and with their attorney, Jeff Jeffrey. There is pending a lawsuit seeking an injunction, service of which has been accepted by all named parties. In order to resolve this pending litigation, the parties agree to the following entry of relief.

Now, therefore, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED** that defendants, and each of them, directly or indirectly, or through any business, corporation, or subsidiary, or as a director, officer, employee, agent, or otherwise be and hereby are strictly and permanently enjoined from practicing law, (except as otherwise authorized by law) including:

- 19. Enjoined from providing consultation, explanation, recommendation, or advice regarding legal matters.

- 1 20. Enjoined from consulting, explaining, recommending or advising any person(s) or discussing  
2 their individual facts and circumstances, relating to their need or desire for legal forms, legal  
3 services, or legal assistance.
- 4 21. Enjoined from obtaining information orally, in writing, or in any other manner relating to  
5 individual facts and circumstances so as to assist any persons with their legal matters through  
6 the exercise of any judgment on behalf of those persons.
- 7 22. Enjoined from advising any persons regarding their eligibility for or advisability of legal  
8 remedies to address any person's particular legal matters.
- 9 23. Enjoined from advising any persons regarding procedural functions of the court system as it  
10 relates to any person's particular legal matters including advice regarding jurisdiction or  
11 venue.
- 12 24. Enjoined from assisting in selecting particular legal forms, documents, or pleadings for  
13 persons to address their legal matters when an informed or trained discretion must be  
14 exercised in the selection or drafting of a document to meet the needs of the persons being  
15 served.
- 16 25. Enjoined from assisting, suggesting, or advising in any way with the preparation or filling out  
17 of legal forms, or any parts of such legal forms, documents or pleadings for any persons  
18 when an informed or trained discretion must be exercised in the selection or drafting of a  
19 document to meet the needs of the persons being served.
- 20 26. Enjoined from assisting, suggesting or advising any persons how forms, documents, or  
21 pleadings should be used to address or to solve particular legal problems.
- 22 27. Nothing included in this Judgment and Decree precludes Defendant(s) Peterson's from  
23 working for someone authorized to practice law so long as he/she/they is/are acting within the  
24 course of his/her duties and under the direction and supervision of an individual authorized to  
25 practice law.

1 28. Nothing in this Judgment and Decree precludes Defendants from:

2 (a) Working for someone authorized to practice law so long as such Defendant is acting  
3 within the course of his or her duties and under the direction and supervision of an individual  
4 authorized to practice law;

5 (b) Selling legal forms to customers so long as the limitations set forth above concerning  
6 personal contact, advice, assistance and form selection are complied with;

7 (c) Typing documents selected by a customer with content provided exclusively by the  
8 customer so long as the limitations set forth above concerning personal contact, advice,  
9 assistance and form selection are complied with. The Defendants may transfer information  
10 from a workbook selected and filled out by a customer to a completed form selected by the  
11 customer so long as the customer has directed the Defendants where and how to utilize the  
12 information in typing the completed form and the limitations set forth above concerning  
13 personal contact, advice, assistance and form selection are complied with;

14 (d) Selling or offering documents that contain a general discussion of law, legal procedure  
15 or practice, provided that Defendants in no way suggest that a particular document pertains to  
16 a customer's particular legal problem.

17 29. In the event that any Defendant violates the terms of this Judgment and Decree, Plaintiff shall  
18 be entitled to reasonable costs and attorney fees in any subsequent action to enforce this  
19 Judgment and Decree which results in a finding of contempt by such Defendant.

20  
21 **Based on the stipulations of the parties, the court enters the following CONCLUSIONS OF**  
22 **LAW:**

23 30. The Oregon State Bar asserted its claims against the Peterson's and We the People's service in  
24 a reasonable amount of time following knowledge of complaints against Defendants and  
25 Defendants have not been substantially prejudiced by any delay.

26 31. The laws and restrictions upon Defendants' business activities, to the extent they may affect

1 Defendants' speech, are not broader than necessary to serve the interest of the public, and a  
2 injunction prohibiting Defendants from engaging in the practice of law will not violate  
3 Defendants' rights of free speech as guaranteed by the First Amendment of the United States  
4 Constitution or by Article I, Section 2 of the Oregon Constitution.

5 32. An injunction will not violate Defendants' right to equal protection guaranteed by the  
6 Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution or Article I, Section 20 of the  
7 Oregon Constitution.


8 33. Plaintiff waives its costs and disbursements including reasonable attorney's fees incurred


