R. v. Desautel: Canadian Supreme Court Recognizes Hunting Rights in British Columbia

Attorney Mark Underhill will discuss the 7-2 Supreme Court of Canada decision, which affirmed the constitutionally protected right of a Sinixt or Lakes member of the Colville Confederated Tribes to hunt on traditional land in Canada for ceremonial purposes, despite the fact that the Sinixt were declared "extinct" in Canada in 1956.
